



# And The Scotland Adventure Continues.....

# ......HR SON Featured Lodge Member, Julia Abraham, Tells a Little About Her Time in Scotland as Well......









"I dearly love Scotland—it has a wild, untamed character. Scotland's history is storied—massacre at Glen Coe, Battle of Stirling, the borders, Highland clearances, etc., but I think the connection to Norway is interesting. The Orkney flag and the Norwegian flag are so similar—the only

difference being that the Orkney flag is



yellow where the Norwegian flag is white. Scotland acquired the Orkney and Shetland islands from Norway as part of a dowry in about 1470 (as also mentioned on previous page). The "Shetland bus" was vital to Norway during WW2. Taking the ferry from John O' Groats to Stromness, Orkney, across the Pentland Firth is a wild ride. They don't refer to it as the "mixing bowl" for nothing! "Pentland" is thought to be derived from old Norse, "petlandsfjörd" (fjord of Pictland). The Neolithic sites in Orkney are amazing—Skara Brae, Ring of Brodgar, standing stones of Stemness (older than Stonehenge), and many more that I didn't get to see. The stone homes in Skara Brae were connected by tunnels. I asked myself: "Could I have survived long in a stone village with the harsh weather of the area (and I was there in August)?" I can't imagine enduring a winter at Skara Brae. If you have a chance to go—Take it!"

# **Did You Know?**

An 1,100-year-old sword was fairly recently found high in the mountains of Norway (higher than any previous such objects).

The Viking sword, thought to be from around A.D 850 to 950, was found by reindeer hunters, Norway's Oppland county. The hunters names are Geir Inge Follestad and Einar Åmbakk from the Østra region. A regional archaeologist, Espen Finstad, called the find in the Lesja region of the mountainous county "fantastic." He added, "Discovery of Viking relics high in the Norwegian mountains is remarkable in itself. We have searched the area in a radius of around 50 meters and have used a metal detector but found no other objects. So, it's a mystery as to why the sword was in that particular place," he told NRK. Finstad was also quoted as saying, "Several hundred similar Viking weapons have been found in Norway, but none at such a high level in the mountains." The site of the discovery is three hours from the nearest road. Due to the snow and ice in that region, the sword was in good condition. The hunters who discovered the sword stated that they know their find is "quite special."



#### **Sons of Norway Scholarship Programs**

Each year Sons of Norway award scholarships and grants to promote the heritage and culture of Norway and provide assistance to our members, lodges and their communities. You may e-mail questions on any of these scholarships to <a href="mailto:foundation@sofn.com">foundation@sofn.com</a> prior to submission. Application forms are available from www.sonsofnorway.com.

#### The Astrid G. Cates Scholarship

Applicants must have a certificate of completion from high school and be enrolled in post-secondary training or education (college, vocational or trade school) and be a current member of SON or children or grandchildren of a current member of districts 1-6. Applicants must have a strong financial need and be between the ages of 17 and 22. Applications must be postmarked no later than March 1<sup>st</sup> (please mail all required items in one envelope. Incomplete applications will not be considered).

#### The King Olav V. Norwegian-American Heritage Fund

Any North American, 18 years or older, who has demonstrated a keen and sincere interest in the Norwegian heritage and/or any Norwegian who has demonstrated an interest in American heritage and who desires to further the study of these heritages at a recognized educations institution is eligible to apply. Deadline for application is March 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### **Nancy Lorraine Jensen Memorial Scholarship:**

Applicants must be female American citizens between 17 and 35 years old on the date the application is submitted. The applicant must be a full-time undergraduate who has completed at least one term, majoring in chemistry or physics, or in chemical, electrical or mechanical engineering. They must also be SON members or children or grandchildren of members (employment at the NASA Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Maryland may be substituted in lieu of belonging to SON).

#### Oslo International Summer School Scholarship:

Award decisions are based upon academic potential, benefits to SON or the larger Norwegian community, Involvement in school and community activities, financial need and other, e.g., work experience. Deadline March 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### The Sons of Norway Foundation Heritage and Cultural Fund

This is an endowment fund from which only interest will be spent. Two types of grants are available:

<u>The SON Foundation/Local Lodge Partnership Grants</u>. These are small matching grants awarded to lodges. A maximum of \$500 may be given. Deadline – May 1 of each year.

#### The General Heritage and Culture Grant

These may be awarded to individuals, groups or organizations. Up to \$3000 may be received. Deadline January 15 of each year.

# **Happy Valentine's Day**







\*\*Can Make in Drop Cookie Form or Use a Cookie Press (Preferably a Heart-Shaped Press). \*\*

## **Ingredients**

½ cup butter

1 cup All-Purpose Flour

2 Eggs

14 Cup White Sugar

½ Teaspoon Vanilla Extract (Can use Lemon Extract in Place of Vanilla for a Citrusy taste).

### **Directions**

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C).

Hard boil the eggs and separate the yolks. Cream the butter and hard-boiled egg yolks. Beat in the sugar and add the flour vanilla extract. Mix thoroughly. Put through a cookie press or arrange by teaspoonfuls on ungreased cookie sheets.

Bake 10 to 12 minutes, or until lightly browned.
